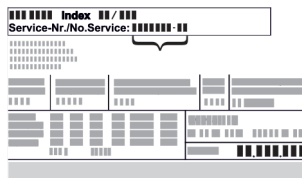

1 General safety instructions

- Please keep this assembly manual in a safe place so you can refer back to it at any time.
- If you pass the appliance on, please hand this assembly manual to the new owner.
- Read this assembly manual before installation and use in order to use the appliance safely and correctly. Follow the instructions, safety instructions and warning messages included at all times. They are important for ensuring you can operate and install the appliance safely and without any problems.
- First read the general safety instructions in the “General safety instructions” section of the **operating instructions**, which accompany these installation instructions, and follow them. If you cannot find the **operating instructions**, you can download the **operating instructions** from the internet by entering the service number at home.liebherr.com/fridge-

serial tag:

- Observe the warning messages and other detailed information in the other sections when installing the appliance:

2 Installation conditions

The installation conditions are crucial to ensure that you can operate your appliance safely, efficiently, and trouble-free.

- Observe all safety instructions.
- Observe the installation location and position in the room.



WARNING

Danger of fire due to incorrect positioning!

If the power supply cable or plug touches the back of the appliance, the vibration can damage the power supply cable or the plug resulting in a short circuit.

- ▶ Make sure the power supply cable is not trapped under the appliance when you position the appliance.
- ▶ Install the appliance so that it does not touch any plugs or power cables.
- ▶ Do not connect any appliances to sockets in the area of the back of the appliance.
- ▶ Do **not** place and operate power strips/power distributors and other electronic devices (such as halogen transformers) at the back of the appliances.



WARNING

Risk of fire due to moisture!

If live parts or the power cord get wet, this can cause a short circuit.

- The appliance is designed for use in enclosed spaces. Do not operate the appliance in open space or in damp areas or where there is spray.



WARNING

Leaking refrigerant and oil!

Fire. The refrigerant contained within the appliance is environmentally friendly, but flammable. The oil contained within the appliance is flammable. Escaping refrigerant and oil can ignite if they are of high enough concentration and are exposed to an external heat source.

- Do not damage the pipelines of the coolant circuit and the compressor.

2.1 Installation location

- Only set up and used the appliance in enclosed spaces.
- Only operate the appliance in installed condition.
- If the appliance is set up in a very humid environment, condensation may form on the outside of it. Always ensure good ventilation at the installation location.
- The more refrigerant there is in the appliance, the larger the room in which the appliance is installed must be. If the room is too small, a flammable gas/air mixture may form in the event of a leak. Per 8 g (0.28 oz) refrigerant, the installation space must be at least 1 m³ (35.5 ft³) in size. Information on the refrigerant contained can be found on the type plate inside the appliance.
- The floor at the installation location must be horizontal and level.

2.2 Position in the space

- Do not install the appliance in an area with direct sunlight, next to a heating unit or similar.
- You can install the appliance directly next to an oven.
- If you install the appliance directly next to an oven, its energy consumption may increase slightly. This depends on the service life and how often the oven is used.
- Only fit the appliance into stable, solid cabinets.
- Use in potentially explosive atmospheres is not permitted.

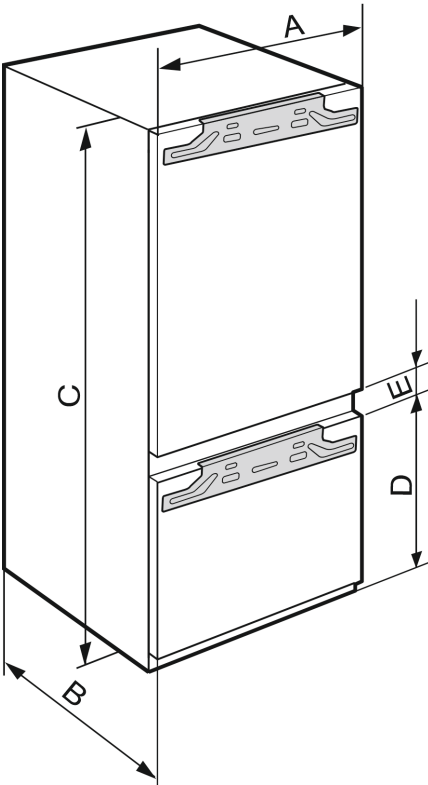

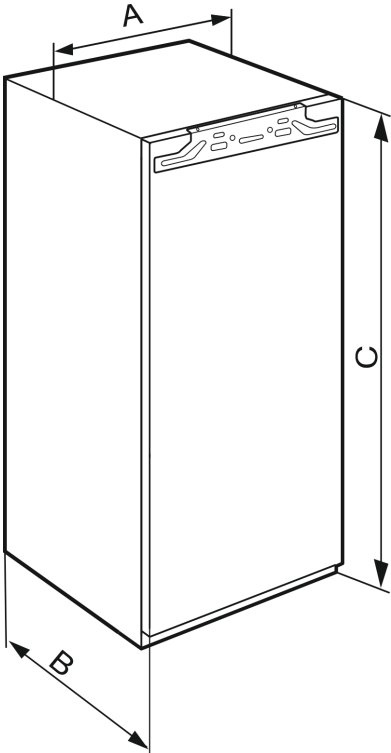

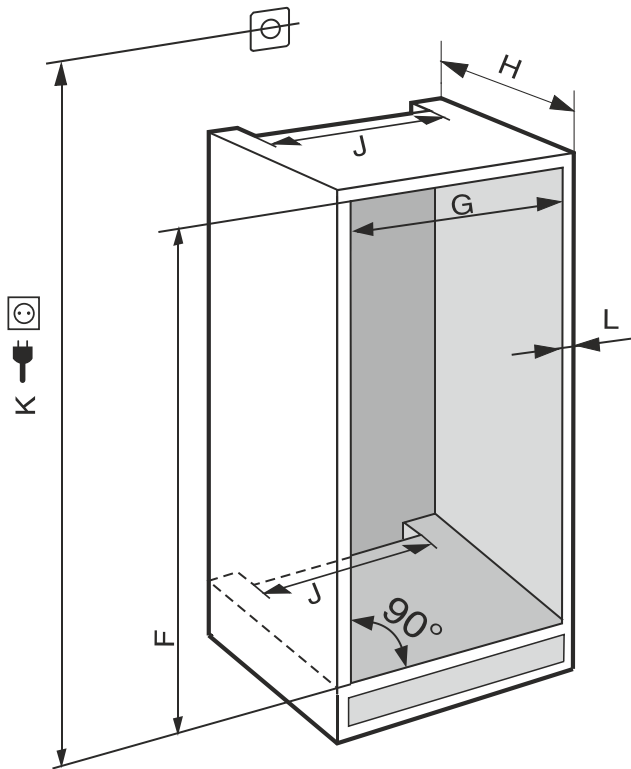


Fig. 3 (K): max. 2100 mm (82 11/16 in)

The specified energy consumption was determined with a kitchen unit depth of 560 mm (22 1/16 in). The appliance will work properly at a kitchen unit depth of 550 mm (21 11/16 in), but with a slightly higher energy consumption.

- Check the wall thickness of adjacent units: It must be a minimum of 16 mm (5/8 in) .
- Only fit the appliance into stable, solid kitchen units. Secure the unit against tipping.

- Align the cabinets with a level and a try square. If necessary, level them by putting something underneath them.
- Make sure floor and the side panels of the cabinet are at right angles to each other.

5 Ventilation requirements

NOTICE

Covered vents!

Damage. Appliance can overheat, which can reduce the service life of various parts of the appliance and lead to functional impairments.

- Always ensure good ventilation.
- Always keep vents or ventilation grills in the appliance housing and in the kitchen structure (built-in appliance) unobstructed.
- Never block air vents of the fan.

Note

The clearance at the back of the appliance must be 13 mm (1/2 in). If the clearance is less than 13 mm (1/2 in), energy consumption may increase.

Comply with the ventilation gaps:

- The depth of the ventilation shaft at the back of the cabinet must be at least 38 mm (1 1/2 in).
- At least 200 cm² (31 in²) is required for the ventilation gap cross sections in the plinth and the housing cabinet.
- Basically, the larger the ventilation cross-section, the more efficiently the appliance will run.

Sufficient ventilation is required for the operation of the appliance. The ventilation grids provided ensure an effective ventilation cross-section on the appliance of 200 cm² (31 in²). If you replace the ventilation grids with a cover plate the ventilation cross-section must be as least as large as the ventilation grid provided by the manufacturer.

6 Custom panel weights

NOTICE

An excessively heavy custom panel can potentially cause damage!

If the custom panel is too heavy, damage to the hinges cannot be ruled out, which may compromise the functionality of the unit.

- Before installing the custom panel, ensure the custom panel does not exceed the permissible weight.

7 Water connection*

If your appliance has a fixed water connection, an elbow connector with screen filter is supplied with it.

Requirements for the water pressure:	(see 7.1 Water pressure)
Make the water connection:	(see 15 Connecting the appliance to the water supply*)

7.1 Water pressure

The water connection line and solenoid valve of the appliance are suitable for a water pressure of up to 1 MPa (10 bar (145.04 psi)).

To ensure that the appliance functions correctly (flow rate, ice cube size, noise level), maintain the following water pressure:

If the pressure is higher than 6.2 bar (89.92 psi):

- ▶ Connect a pressure reducer.
- ▶ Make the water connection. (see 15 Connecting the appliance to the water supply*)

8 Transporting the appliance

8.1 Transporting the appliance for initial installation

Make sure that the following requirements are fulfilled:

- ☐ Appliance is packaged.
- ☐ The appliance is upright.
- ▶ Have two people transport the appliance.
- ▶ Unpack the appliance. (see 9 Unpacking the appliance)

8.2 Transporting the appliance after initial installation

Observe the following instructions if you want to transport or move the appliance after initial installation.

Make sure that the following requirements are fulfilled:

- ☐ Appliance is empty.
- ☐ The appliance is upright.
- ☐ Appliance with door(s): The door is secured against undesired opening.
- ☐ Appliance with pull-out cart: The pull-out cart is secured against undesired opening.
- ☐ Appliance is unpacked.
- ▶ Have two people transport the appliance.

9 Unpacking the appliance

If the appliance is damaged check with the supplier immediately before connecting it.

- ▶ Check the appliance and packaging for damage during transport. If you suspect any damage, please contact your supplier immediately.
- ▶ Remove all materials that could prevent it from being installed properly or prevent proper ventilation from the back or the side panels of the appliance.
- ▶ Remove all protective films from the appliance. Do not use sharp or pointed objects for this.

10 Setting up the appliance



CAUTION

Risk of injury due to heavy appliance!

- ▶ Have two people transport the appliance to its installation site.



WARNING

Danger of injury and damage due to the appliance being unstable!

The appliance can tip over.

- Secure the appliance as described in the instructions.



WARNING

Danger of fire and damage!

- Do not place devices that give off heat, e.g. microwaves, toasters, etc. on the appliance.

If possible, have a professional install the appliance in your kitchen cabinet unit.

Do not install the appliance without assistance.

10.1 After setup

- Remove all transport packaging.

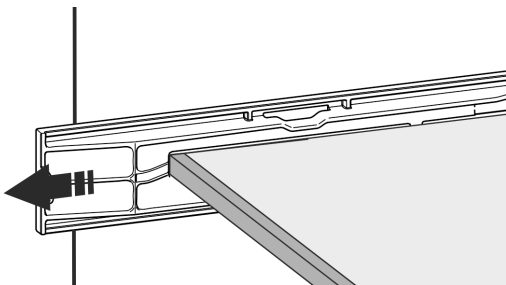
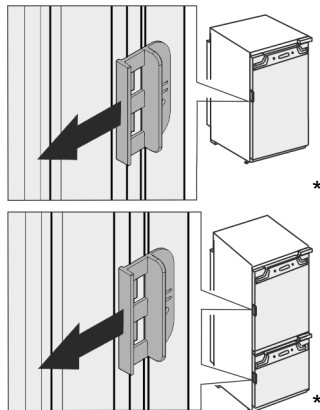

- Pull off the transport lock on the appliance door.

- Clean the appliance (see User Guide, Cleaning the appliance).
- Write down the type (model, number), appliance name, appliance/serial number, date of purchase and dealer address in the designated fields (see User Guide, About the appliance).

11 Setting up several appliances

The appliances were developed for different installation options. If you want to install several appliances side by side or on top of each other, make sure that the following requirements are met:

- Only install those appliances side by side or on top of each other that were developed for the purpose.
- Observe the instructions and the following table.

NOTICE

Risk of damage caused by water condensate!

- Do not set up the appliance next to another refrigeration/freezer unit.

NOTICE

Risk of damage from condensation!

- Do not set up the appliance directly above another refrigeration/freezer unit.

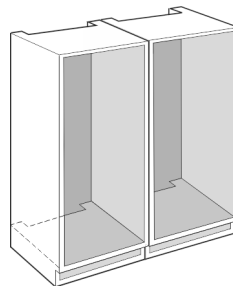

12 Disposal of packaging



WARNING

Danger of suffocation from packaging materials and films!

- Do not allow children to play with packaging materials.

The packaging is made from recyclable materials:

- Corrugated card/cardboard

14 Reversing the door

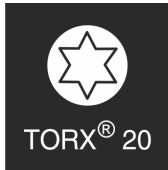

Live parts!

Damage to electrical components.

► Pull the power plug before changing the door hinges.

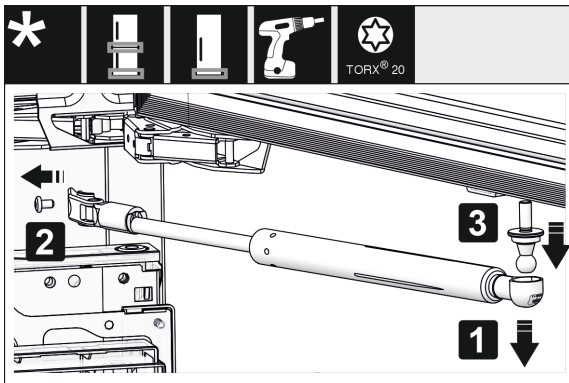

► Removing the soft stop damper: Remove the soft stop damper from the ball stud (1). Unscrew the retainer (2). Remove the ball stud with a screwdriver (3).*

Note

If the closing damper is just above the floor, you can only remove the ball pins after the door has been taken off.*

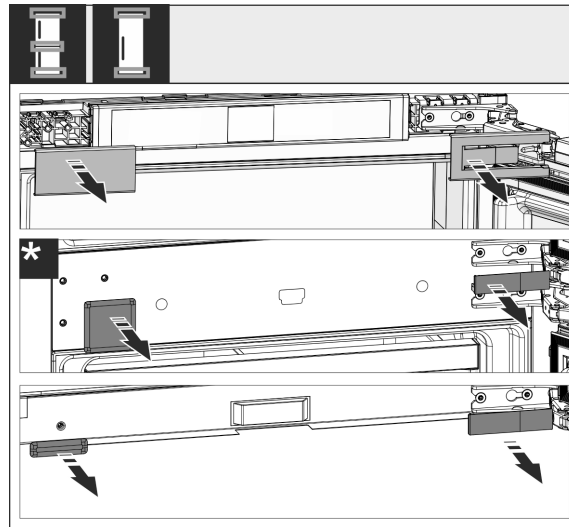

► Remove covers.

Note

When removing the covers, make sure that the surface is not scratched.

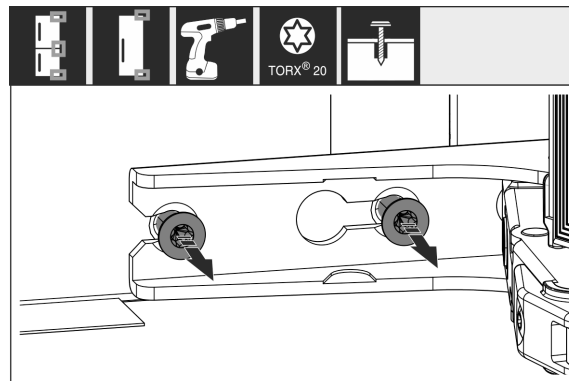

► Loosen the screws on **all** hinges but do not remove them.

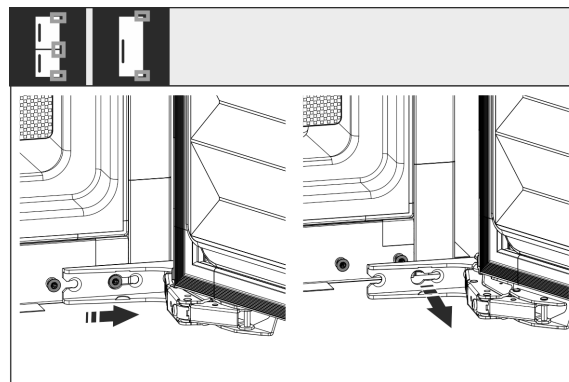

► Remove the door: Push the door forward and then out, unhook it and put it to one side.

Reversing the door

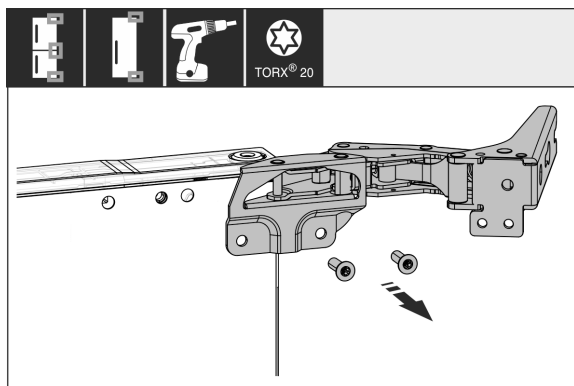

- Unscrew all hinges and set aside together with the screws.

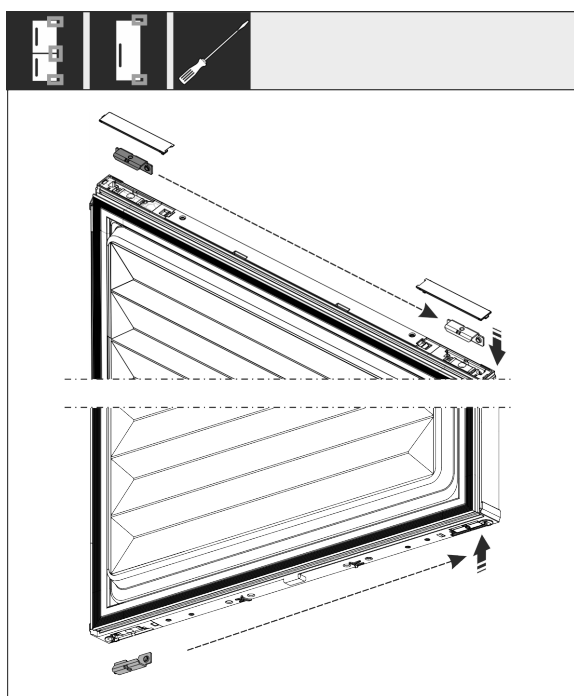

- Loosen and shift the bracket at the top and bottom of the door. The bracket must be shifted so you can screw on the hinges.

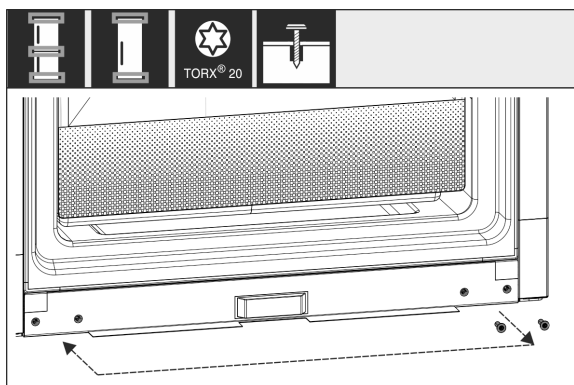

- Shift the screws to fasten the hinge. Do not screw tightly after shifting – you need to hang the hinges later.

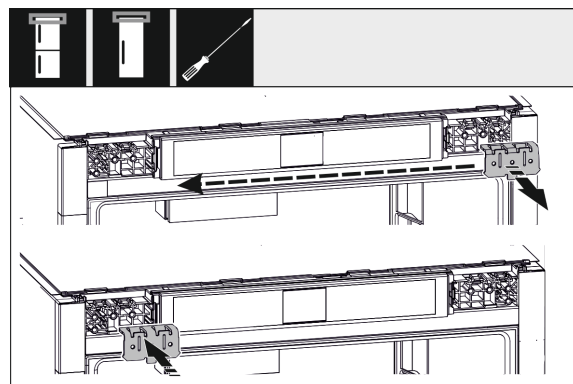

- Swap the fixing bracket to the opposite side.

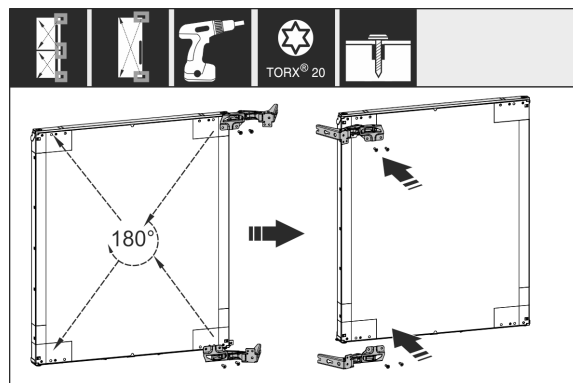

- Turn all hinges 180° to the opposite side and screw firmly.

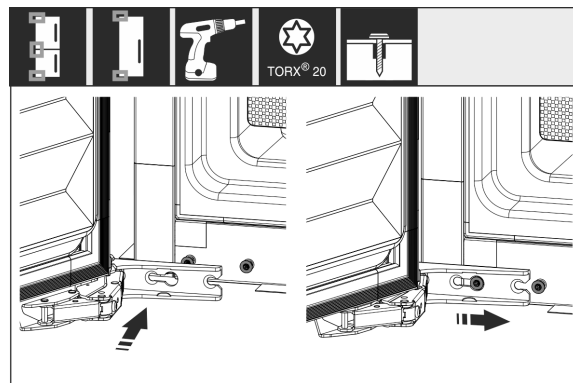

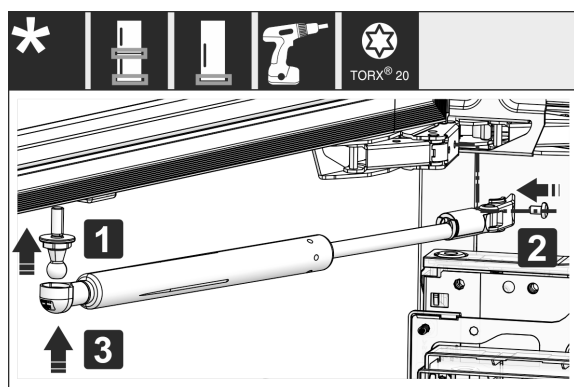

- ▶ Refit the closing dampers: Screw in the ball studs (1), tighten the bracket (2), and hang the closing dampers in the ball studs.*
- ▶ Check all screws and retighten if necessary.

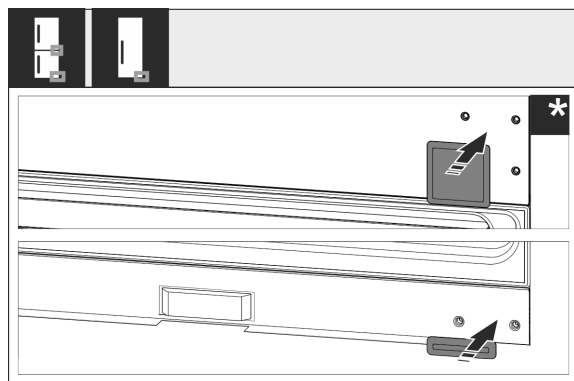

- ▶ Reassemble the bottom and center cover. Only replace the remaining covers after installing the appliance back into the cabinet.

15 Connecting the appliance to the water supply*

Make sure that the following requirements are fulfilled:

- ❑ The dimensions for the water supply connection are known and complied with.
- ❑ The correct water pressure is maintained.
- ❑ Water is supplied to the appliance via a cold water pipe that can withstand the operating pressure and is connected to the drinking water supply.
- ❑ All equipment and devices used for the water supply comply with the applicable regulations in the country of use.
- ❑ The back of the appliance is accessible so that you can connect the appliance to the drinking water supply.
- ❑ A coupler between the R3/4 connection thread and the 1/4" OD copper pipe is supplied.
- ❑ There is a screen filter with a seal in the coupler. The screen filter with a seal is supplied.

- ❑ A 1/4" OD copper pipe is used to connect the water supply to the solenoid valve. **This is not supplied with the appliance.**
- ❑ There is an adaptor between the hose 1/4" OD copper pipe and the domestic water connection so that you can turn off the water supply if necessary.
- ❑ The adaptor is not directly behind the appliance and is easily accessible. This way, you can push the appliance as far as possible into the cabinet recess and can quickly turn off the faucet if necessary.



WARNING

Risk of electric shock from water!

- ▶ Before connecting to the water hose: Disconnect the appliance from the mains.
- ▶ Before connecting to water lines: Shut off the water supply.
- ▶ Make sure that only qualified personnel connect the device to the drinking water supply.



WARNING

Risk of poisoning due to contaminated water!

- ▶ Connect to potable water supply only.

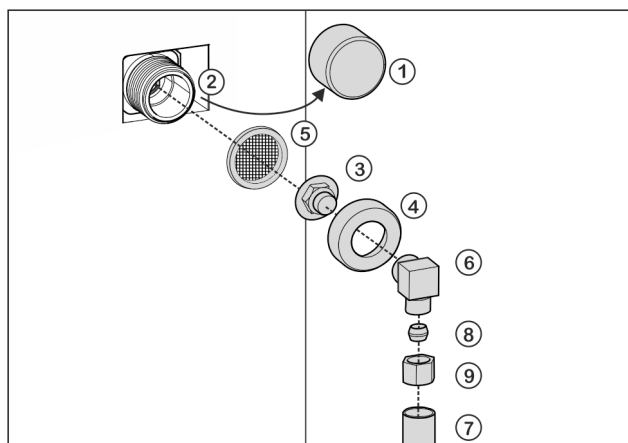

NOTICE

Risk of damage from incorrect installation!

- ▶ Do not damage or kink the water pipe (e. g. copper pipe) during installation.
- ▶ Do not damage or kink the water pipe (e. g. copper pipe) during installation in the cabinet recess.

Connecting the coupler to the appliance:

- ▶ Remove cap Fig. 19 (1) from solenoid valve Fig. 19 (2).

Fit the appliance into the recess

- ▶ Insert coupler *Fig. 19 (3)* into union nut *Fig. 19 (4)*.

NOTICE

The filter can be damaged if not correctly fitted!

- ▶ Observe the following instruction when putting in the filter.

- ▶ Insert the filter *Fig. 19 (5)* with the recess pointing down towards the coupler *Fig. 19 (3)*.

NOTICE

The thread can be damaged if the union nut is over-tightened!

- ▶ Observe the following instructions for fitting the union nut on the solenoid valve.

- ▶ Screw the union nut *Fig. 19 (4)* by hand onto the thread of the solenoid valve *Fig. 19 (2)* until it is firmly in place.

- ▶ The coupler is connected to the appliance.

90° bend in the water connection: Connecting the water hose to the elbow connector:

- ▶ Screw on angle piece *Fig. 19 (6)*.
- ▶ Connect the water pipe *Fig. 19 (7)* (e. g. 1/4" OD copper pipe) with the clamp ring *Fig. 19 (8)* and nut *Fig. 19 (9)* to the elbow connector *Fig. 19 (6)*.
- ▶ The water pipe is connected to the elbow connector.

-or-

No bend in the water connection: Connecting the water hose to the coupler:

- ▶ If necessary: Fasten the water pipe *Fig. 19 (7)* to the housing with the guide clip.
- ▶ Put angle piece *Fig. 19 (6)* to one side.
- ▶ Connect the water pipe *Fig. 19 (7)* (e. g. 1/4" OD copper pipe) with the clamp ring *Fig. 19 (8)* and nut *Fig. 19 (9)* to the coupler *Fig. 19 (3)*.
- ▶ If necessary: Fasten the water pipe *Fig. 19 (7)* to the housing with the guide clip.
- ▶ The water pipe is connected to the coupler.

Fitting the adaptor between the water pipe and the water supply:

- ▶ Connect the water pipe (e. g. 1/4" OD copper pipe) to the water supply with a suitable adaptor.
- ▶ The water is connected to the water supply with an adaptor.

15.2 Check the water system

Before you completely install the appliance in the cabinet recess, Liebherr recommends checking the water system for leaks.

- ▶ Put in the InfinitySpring water tank. (see 18 Water tank*) *
- ▶ Put in the InfinitySpring water filter. (see 19 Water filter*) *
- ▶ Slowly turn on the water feed.
- ▶ Check the hose, water feed and connections for leaks.
- ▶ The water system has now been checked for leaks.
- ▶ The water system is not leaking: You can install the appliance completely in the cabinet recess.

Note

InfinitySpring: Before the first use, you must put the InfinitySpring into operation. To do this you must bleed and clean the water system. (see Quick Start Guide or operating instructions)*

IceMaker: Before the first use, you must clean the IceMaker. (see Quick Start Guide or operating instructions)*

- Screw the mounting brackets on the left and right of the recess floor, flush to the side wall.

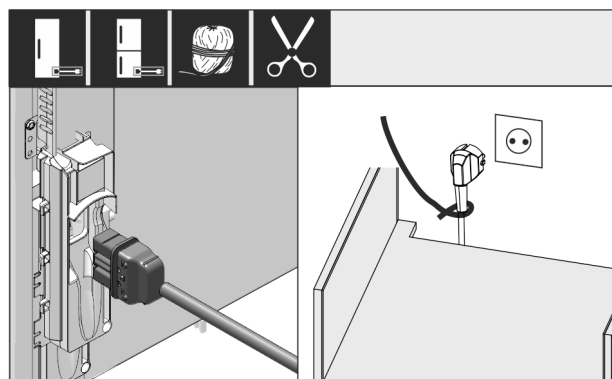

- Fully insert the IEC socket of the power cable completely into the appliance plug on the rear side of the appliance. Ensure the IEC socket is firmly in place.
- Use a string to route the power plug to a socket outlet that is freely accessible.

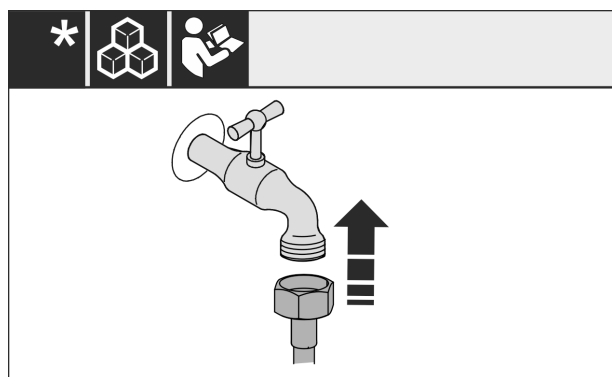

- If necessary, install the water connection at this point, following the instructions in the User Guide.*

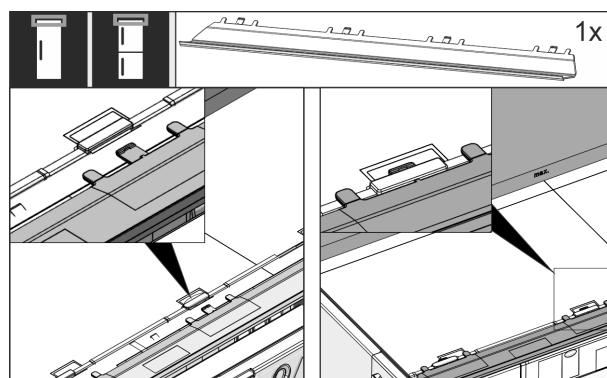

- Insert the adapter panel on the top of the appliance. The panel can be moved to both sides.

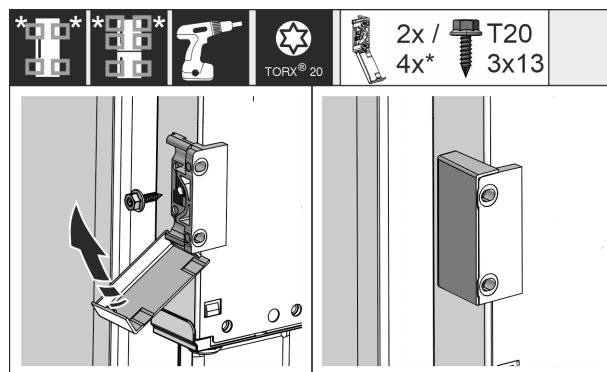

- After assembly, fold the covers onto the bracket.

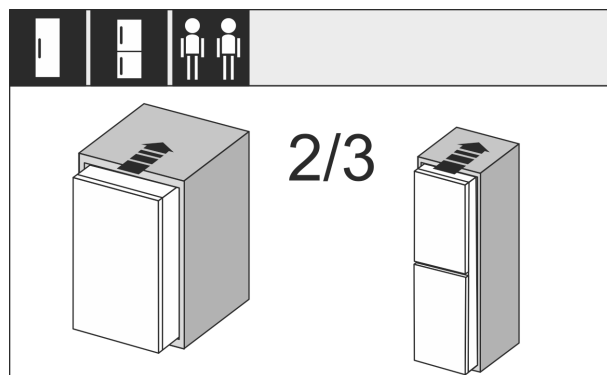

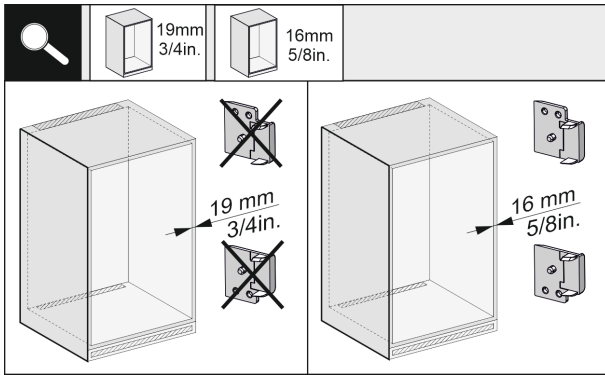

- Check whether the unit side wall is 16 mm (5/8 in) or 19 mm (3/4 in) thick.

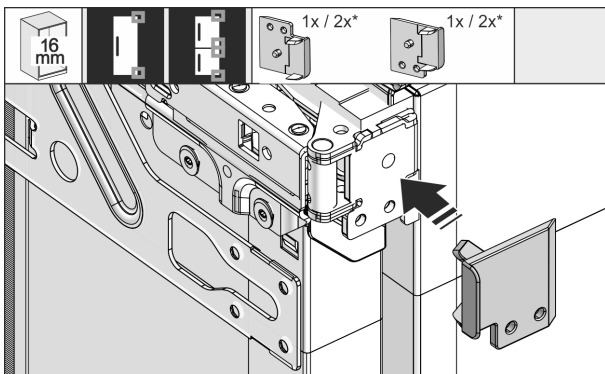

- 19 mm (3/4 in) thick unit side walls: You do not need a spacer.

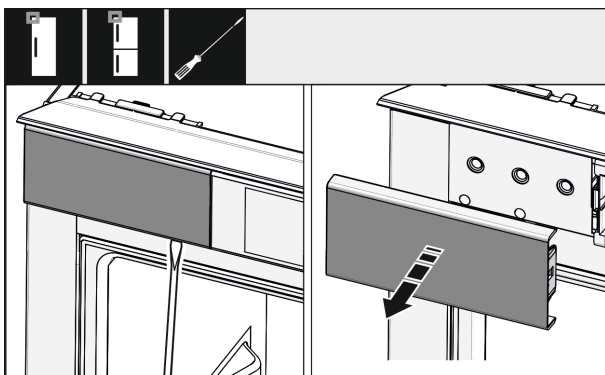

- Use a screwdriver to loosen the cover at the top left and then remove it.

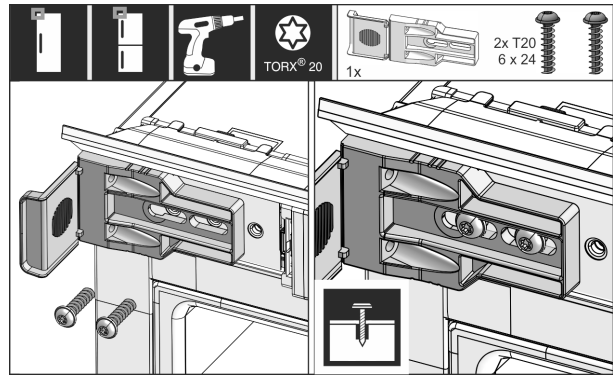

- Loosely screw on the mounting bracket. The bracket should still be easy to move.

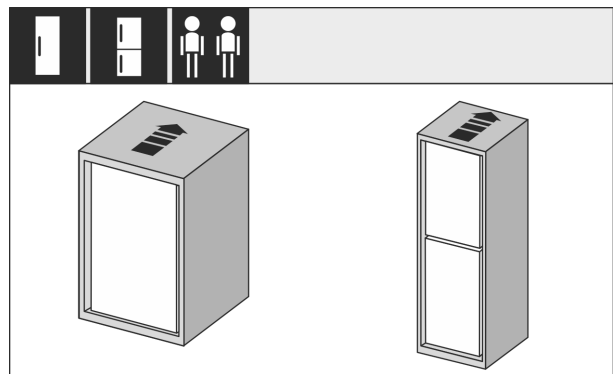

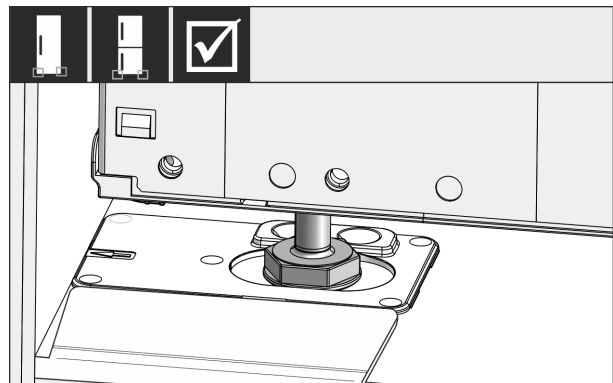

WARNING

- Do not operate the appliance with a defective power cable.
- Push the appliance all the way into the unit recess. The adjustable feet must rest in the recesses in the brackets on both sides.

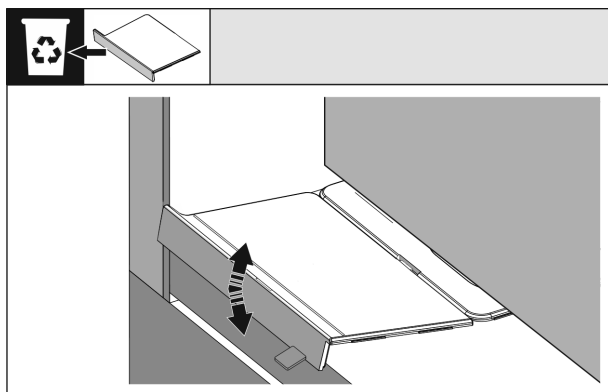

- Remove the floor mounting bracket stopper. Loosen the stopper by moving it and, if necessary, pull it off with the help of pliers.

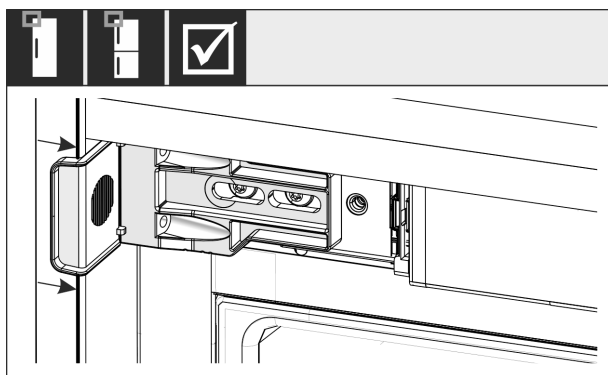

- Check that the appliance is flush in the cabinet recess. The mounting bracket must be attached to the side wall of the cabinet recess.

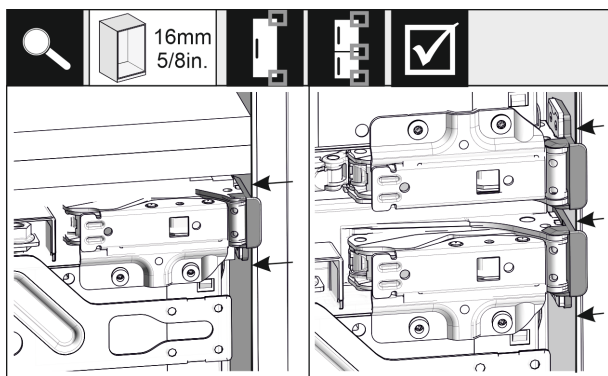

Install leveling rails if the recess height is greater than 1400 mm (55 1/8 in):

You must install leveling rails underneath the appliance for any recess height that is greater than 1400 mm (55 1/8 in). The leveling rails **minimize the sound level**. Two leveling rails and a mounting handle are included in the enclosed package as standard for recess heights above 1400 mm (55 1/8 in).

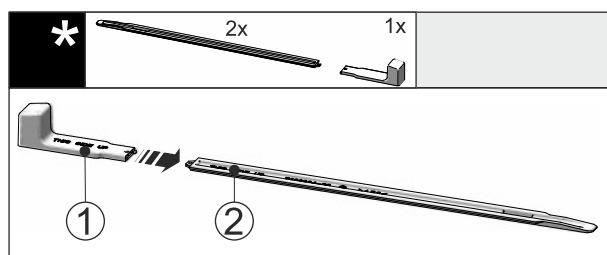

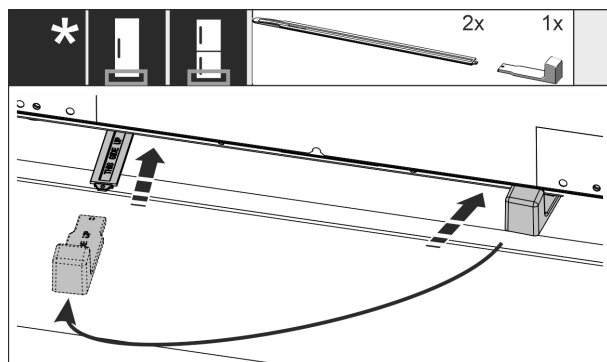

- Proceed in the same manner with the second leveling rail.

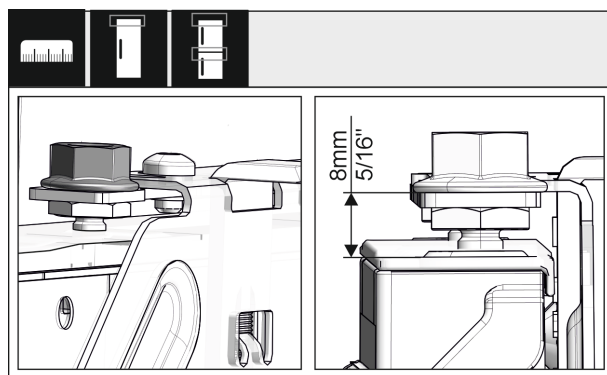

- Check the preset of 8 mm (5/16 in) from the upper edge of the appliance door to the crosspiece support.

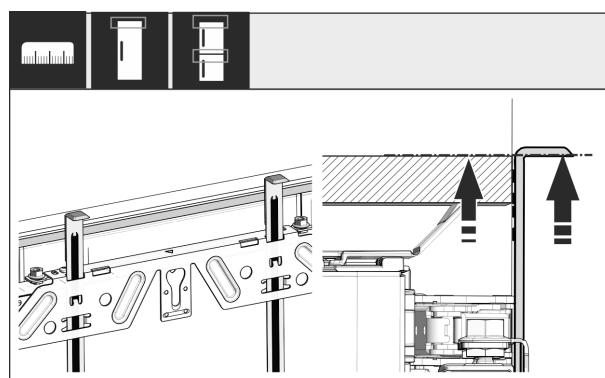

- Push up mounting aids to the height of the cabinet door. Bottom stop edge of the fitting aid = top edge of the door to be fitted.

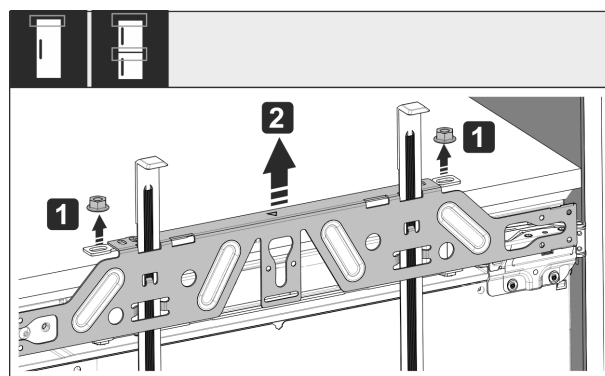

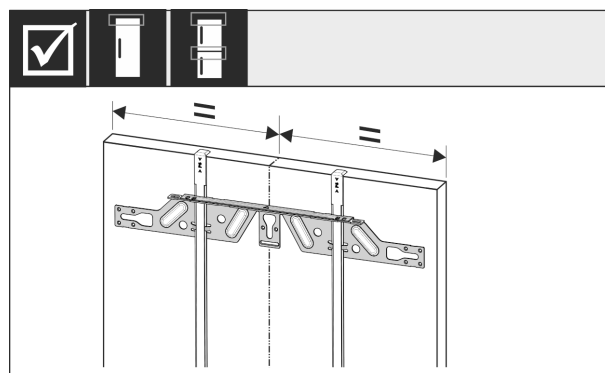

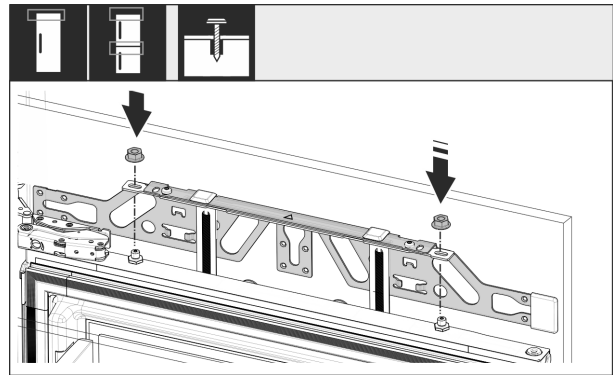

- Attach the custom panel and loosely screw the lock nuts onto the adjusting bolts.

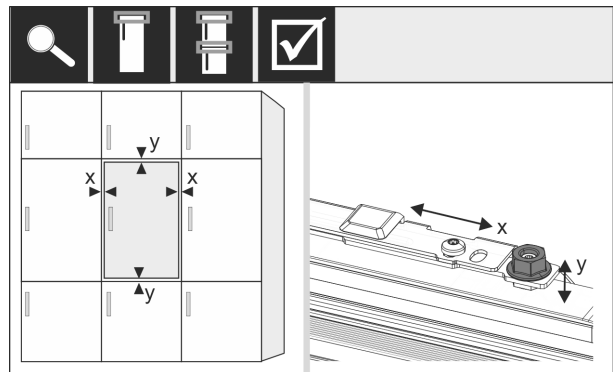

- Align the custom panel in the X and Y direction using the adjusting bolts.

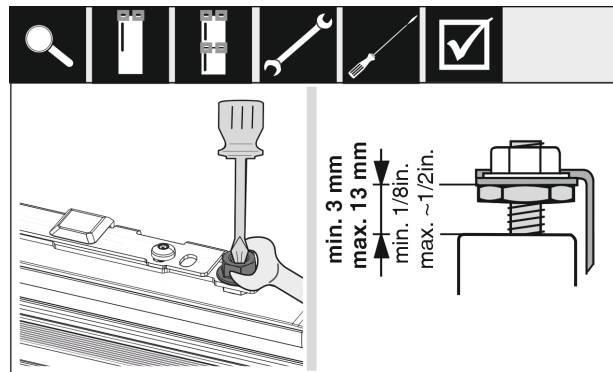

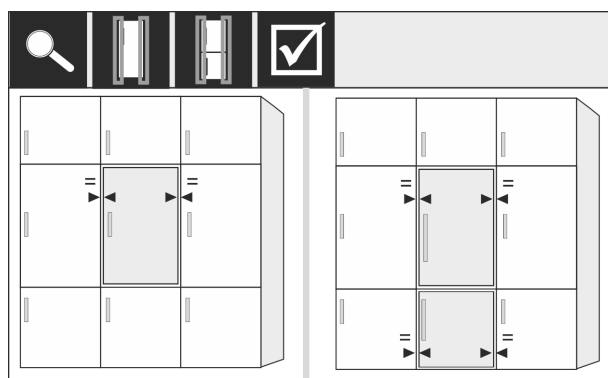

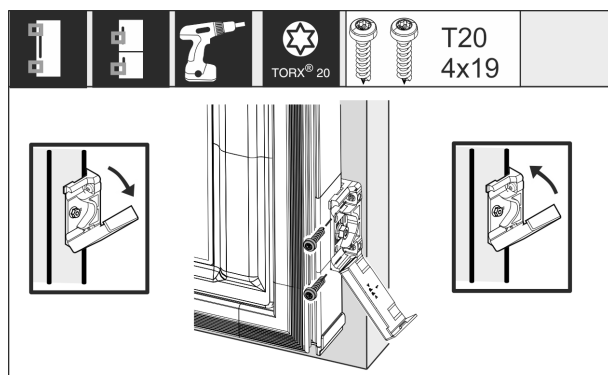

Mounting the fastening bracket on the custom panel:

- Open the cover.
- Mounting the fastening bracket on the custom panel:
 - Align the front edge of the mounting bracket parallel with the custom door panel edge and screw the bracket down tightly.
- Mounting the fastening bracket on the custom panel:
 - Fold up the cover.

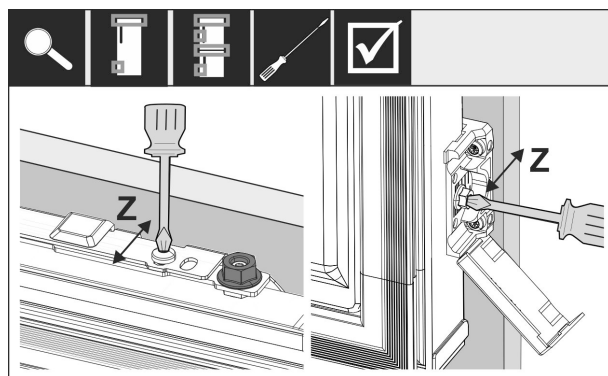

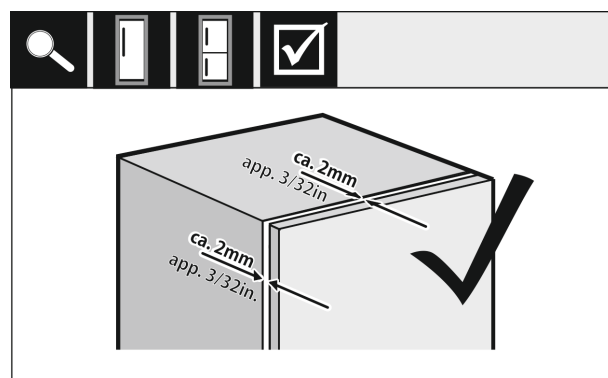

- Check all the screws and tighten them if necessary.

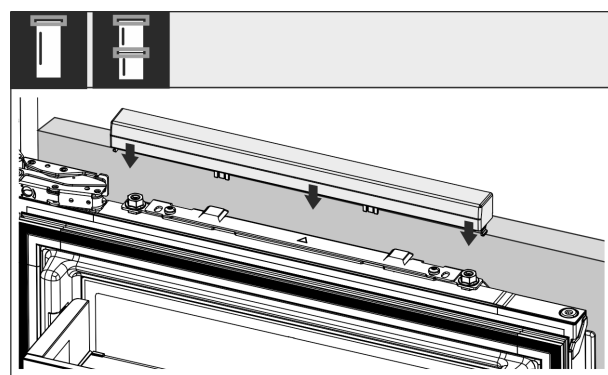

- Put on the top cover.

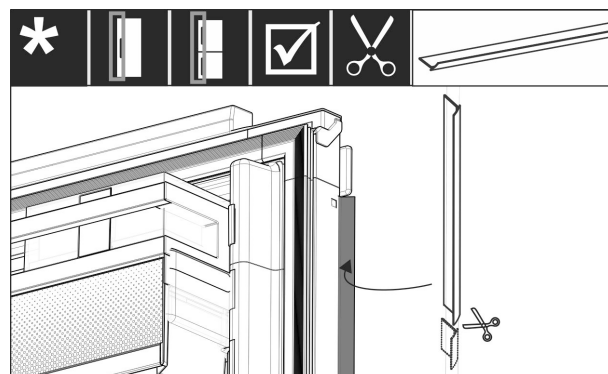

- Cut the sealing strip to the required length.
- Insert the sealing strip between the front panel and the appliance door.

To make sure the appliance is correctly installed and there will not be any icing up, condensation or malfunctions, the following criteria apply:

- The door must close properly.
- The custom door panel must not touch the body of the unit.
- The seal on the upper corner on the handle side must be fitted securely.
- Check recess installation according to the criteria above.

17 Cabinet fronts

17.1 Dimensions

Depending on your model, you will need one or two cabinet doors. The size of the cabinet door(s) depends on the overall recess size and cabinet unit thickness.

Note

Observe the relevant appliance and recess dimensions as well as the installation sketches.

General requirements:

- Please note our recommendations for the specific appliance relating to size and weight for fixed door installation. (see 6 Custom panel weights)
- The body of the unit should be at least 16 mm (5/8 in) thick but not more than 19 mm (3/4 in).
- When mounting a 2-door cabinet door, observe the recommended clearance.*

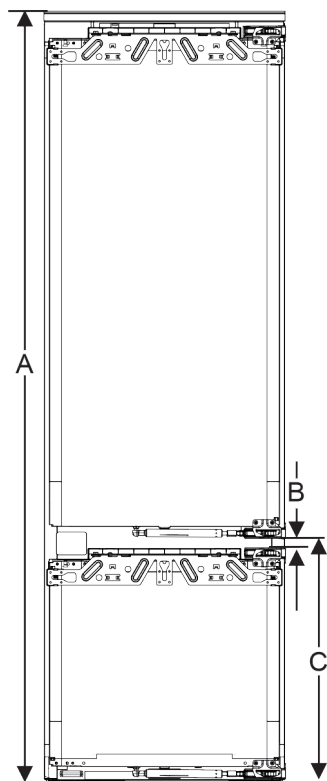


Fig. 68 Clearances for a 2-door cabinet door*

Other cabinet door above, below or next to it:

- The vertical gap between custom panels must be 4 mm (1/8 in).
- The horizontal gap between custom panels must be 4 mm (1/8 in). Check the risk of them clashing here. (see 17.3 Setting the clearance to avoid collision)

Weight and hinges:

- For heavy cabinet fronts, the hinge is subject to a heavy load. The hinge may be damaged. Here, observe the maximum weight specifications for your appliance in the cabinet front weights chapter (see 6 Custom panel weights).
- If the cabinet front exceeds the maximum permitted weight, an appliance with door-tracking device can help by loading the weight over several concealed hinges on the cabinet.
- If you use long unit fronts that protrude far above the appliances, we recommend an additional door hinge (e.g. Kamat), which must have the same pivot point as the fixed door hinge used with your appliance. By using another hinge (Kamat), the weight is shared over several points. The use of a milled compensating fastening is recommended for high unit fronts to counteract warping (convex/concave).

17.2 Mounting the cabinet front(s)

When installing, note:

- Cabinet front must be installed symmetrically to the refrigerator door.
- Adjoining cabinet front is exactly level.
- Adjoining cabinet front has the same edge radius as the front of the appliance.
- Cabinet front is flat and tension-free.
- The front panel has a minimum depth setting of approx. 2 mm (1/16 in) to the body.
- Install the appliance in the recess. (see 16 Fit the appliance into the recess)
- Fasten the front panel to the appliance door. (see 16 Fit the appliance into the recess)
- Check that the front panel can close unobstructed. (see 17.3 Setting the clearance to avoid collision)

17.3 Setting the clearance to avoid collision

After installing the cabinet front(s), check that the cabinet fronts do not collide.

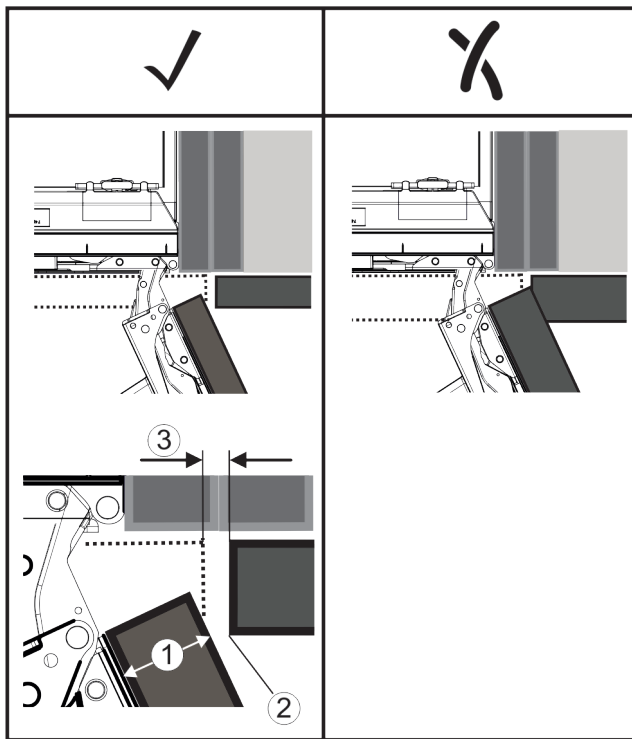

Note

When making adjustments, always make sure that the cabinet front suits the general appearance.

Check the collision factors and adjust them accordingly:

- Determine the front thickness and edge radius.
- Refer to the table for the min./max. clearance dimensions.
- Check the clearance size against the table.
- Do one of the following depending on the measured clearance size.

Clearance size	Description
$S > G_{\max}$	If the clearance size is greater than the two limits, you do not need to make any adjustments.

Clearance size	Description
$S < G_{\min}$	If the clearance size is below the limits, you must increase it. Another option is to increase the edge radius.
$G_{\min} \leq S \leq G_{\max}$	If the clearance is between the two limits, you have to be careful. This will quickly lead to collisions.

18 Water tank*

Depending on the appliance, the water tank of the InfinitySpring can be found behind the bottom-most drawer in the fridge section or the BioFresh part.*

18.1 Inserting the water tank

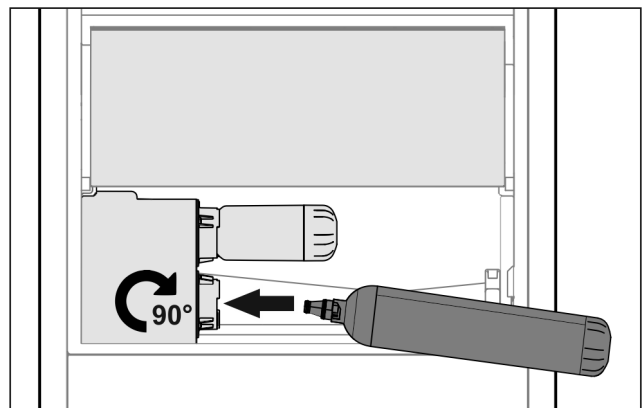

- Remove the drawer.
- Insert the water tank and turn approx. 90° to the right until it engages.
- Check that the water tank is sealed and no water leaks out.
- Insert the drawer.
- Vent the water system. (see Quick Start Guide or User Instructions)

Instead of the water filter, you can use an additional water tank.*

Note

The water tank is available as a spare part.

19 Water filter*

Depending on your model, the water filter is behind the lowest drawer in the fridge or BioFresh compartment.*

It absorbs deposits in the water and reduces the taste of chlorine.

Connecting the appliance to the power supply

- ❑ Replace the water filter at least every 6 months under the specified usage conditions or if the flow rate drops significantly.
- ❑ The water filter contains carbon and can be disposed of with the regular household waste.

Note

The water filter can be purchased from the Liebherr Service Center. The address for your respective country can be found on the back of the instructions.

19.1 Installing the water filter

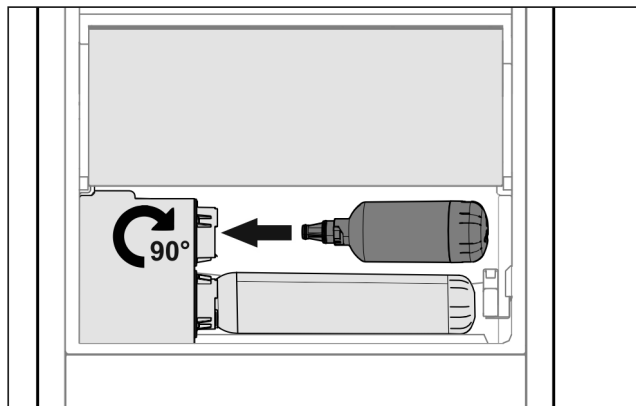

Make sure that the following conditions are met:

- ❑ Water pressure is maintained. (see 7 Water connection*)
- ▶ Remove the drawer.
- ▶ Insert the water filter and turn clockwise approx. 90° until it engages.
- ▶ Make sure the filter does not leak and no water is coming out.
- ▶ Insert the drawer.

Note

New water filters may contain suspended solids.*

- ▶ After changing the filter: Draw and dispose of 3 l (3 qt) water at the InfinitySpring.

- ▶ The water filter is now ready for use.

20 Connecting the appliance to the power supply



WARNING

Danger of electric shock and injury due to damaged appliance or damaged mains cable!

Cuts and fatal injury. If the appliance or the mains cable is damaged during transport, you may be electrocuted. You could also cut yourself on damaged parts of the appliance housing.

- ▶ Check the appliance and the mains cable for damage after transport.
- ▶ Never put the appliance into operation if the appliance or the mains cable are damaged.
- ▶ Contact Customer Service.

You can connect your appliance to the mains using the power cable supplied separately. The mains power cable has an appliance coupler at one end and a mains plug at the other end.

Make sure that the following requirements are fulfilled:

- The appliance and power cable are undamaged.
- The appliance is installed in accordance with the regulations. (see 16 Fit the appliance into the recess)
- Requirements for the electrical connection are met. (see 2 Installation conditions)
- Dimensions for connection in accordance with regulations are known and observed.
- Mains voltage and frequency correspond to the specifications on the type plate.
- The socket is grounded and fused in accordance with regulations.
- The tripping current for the fuse is between 10 A and 16 A.
- Outlet is easily accessible and is not behind the appliance. (see 4 Recess dimensions)

NOTICE

Danger of damage to incorrect operation!

Damage to the electrical components of the appliance.

- ▶ Only use the supplied power cable.



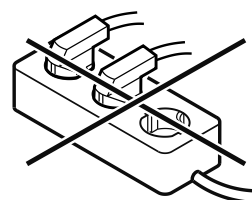

- ▶ Connect the mains plug of the power cord to the power supply. Ensure the main plug is firmly plugged into the outlet.
- ▶ The Liebherr logo appears in the display.
- ▶ The display switches to the standby symbol.
- ▶ If no action is taken within 60 seconds: Standby symbol fades or disappears.
- ▶ Appliance is connected. For initial commissioning, see the next chapter or the operating instructions.
